St. Nicholas Child Care Facility

A new seriousness can be seen at St. Nicholas, as the children prepare for the end of year exams. This is especially obvious with pupils who are preparing to write government exams like Kaoko Shikato who is writing Grade 9 Examinations. St. Nicholas Children who do not pass their Grade 9 or 12 examinations and have exceeded a certain age will be expected to leave the Child Care Facility and will



be able to repeat the year as Home-Based Children either at Makeni School or at a school closer to their home. MEC hopes to support them with school fees, uniforms, and transport money.

Depending on their academic ability we may advise some children to consider continuing their studies at a technical/work-oriented school, like Lusaka Trades where they can study Mechanics, Plumbing, Bricklaying or Electronics. Three of our boys have already done this course and are now all employed. (Gift Machaya, David Mtonga and Patrick Mwamba). If the children are not eligible to be enrolled at

an official trade school, we hope to be able to help them get an unofficial apprenticeship with a Township plumber, bricklayer, or mechanic, to "learn while you work ".

Start of The Rains






Peace Club of Lusaka
